As part of a greater commitment to sustainability, Yeshiva University has established an Environmentally Preferable Procurement (EPP) Policy

Department Responsibility: To assist the university in its goals for a sustainable future, departments are requested to consider environmentally preferable products such as:

- Recycled-content and chlorine-free paper products.
- Energy Star rated appliances and equipment.
- Energy efficient lighting and light bulbs.
- EPEAT certified green electronic equipment.
- Biodegradable-biobased, Green Seal certified cleaning products.
- Recycled building materials: recycled concrete, carpeting made from recycledcontent materials, etc.
- Low or no VOC paints, adhesives and solvents.
- Alternative fuels for use in vehicles such as biodiesel, compressed natural gas, electric, or other alternatives as they become available.
